

## White-plumed Honeyeater *Lichenostomus penicillatus*

*On the Bluff*  
*All year round*



The small, greenish **White-plumed Honeyeater** is found in open woodland where smooth-barked eucalypts are growing. The white plume below the ear is sometimes difficult to see, but the overall olive-green plumage helps to identify this species from other honeyeaters. It is a year-round resident, often found in small groups that keep in contact with the cheery "do-wheet" or "chick-o-wee" call.

## New Holland Honeyeater *Phylidonyris novaehollandiae*

The **New Holland Honeyeater** is a chirpy little bird which is very friendly. At times, groups of more than 10 birds will gather for a "corroboree" of singing and chasing each other about in a playful manner. The yellow flash on the wings is easily seen. The head is mainly black, with a small white cheek-patch and a white eyebrow.

**Body length:** 17 - 19 cm
