Anthochaera chrysoptera

On the Bluff
All year round



The Coastal Banksias planted around Barwon Heads are the favoured trees of the **Little Wattlebird**, but they will visit other trees or plants when they are flowering. The raucous call attracts attention, but the best way to identify this species is from the dark plumage, with white streaks that covers the whole bird. When it flies, the wings have flashes of orange/brown.

Beak-to-tail: 27 -31 cm

Red Wattlebird
Anthochaera carunculata

The loud call of the **Red Wattlebird** is heard all year around. It is the largest of the local honeyeaters, with a red fleshy lobe hanging below its cheek and streaked white underparts. It sometimes nests in trees in residential gardens or around the caravan park.

Beak-to-tail: 32 – 36 cm
